



## ***Tips for Rx File Naming***

### General Tips

Use one the following single letter prefix in the file name so the system knows what application is being exported: **D** = Drill, **N** = Anhydrous, **F** = Floater, **S** = Sprayer, **P** = Planter

File name should consist of Prefix, field number, field name, crop, and year

- Optional: Farm initials, season of application
- i.e., N3WaddellWheat2023, Dpwm3WaddellWhtApr23

The field name, crop type, and year can be shortened if file name is too long.

- i.e., Wheat2023 = Wht23, Canola2023 = Can23, Barley2023 = Bly23

### Monitor Specific Rx Naming Tips

#### **John Deere 2600/2630/Gen 4**

No Punctuation in the file name.

File name is limited to 20 characters.

- This limit INCLUDES the suffix added to layers when exporting to a GRX.
- For Gen 4 monitors, can include “\_N” or “\_S” to the end of the file name for anhydrous or sulphur file for easier sorting of prescriptions when creating the VR report.

Can remove field number if needed but keep it consistent across the farm.

i.e., 3WaddellWht23, D3WaddellWht23 (Drill File), NWaddellWht23 (NH3 File)

#### **All Other Monitors**

No Punctuation in the file name.

File name is limited to 30 characters.

i.e., D3WaddellWheatApr2023 OR Dpwm3WaddellWhtApr23
